AS IT TURNED OUT - NO ILLUSION: Frank Babbitt Transforms an old Revell into Model of Month Bird



Yes, if you thought that two of these pictures look awfully familiar, you're correct. The brown wood grained effect table surface shots are the two July 2022 Model of the Month shots I took for use in August OSS issue.

This article is adapted from my original plan for what became the June/July TAMS issue, and the "preview" that had just begun as my enjoying this model at the June Game Kastle meeting. Frank Babbitt had recently finished her, and didn't even get her out of the carry container originally at that meet. I coaxed him into that, and he briefly outlined all the work he put into this model. I have one in my inventory, so I know what truly hard work this $1/32^{\rm nd}$ Dassault Mirage III was to turn out so. So the "dark grey table" shots are my takes of the night I first encountered her, and I have now included a couple others like them from July meet at MPD Community room, there it won righteously Model of the Month. As you will learn in the minutes, Frank put a resin cockpit, scratchbuilt wheel wells, new wheel doors, replaced pitot tubes with real metal ones. All his ordnance was supplied from Italeri kit source, and the lovely RAAF decals are Red Roo. More detail ahead:




Also, our raffle coordinator, Frank Beltran, asked for contributions to the contest raffle. So, if you're in the mood to give, attend the auction, buy some stuff, and give it to Frank!

Randy Ray gave us a nice video report on his trip to Europe, including many museums and World Model Expo in Eindhoven, Holland. We were impressed by the technical acumen on display (the models and Randy's ability to get his computer to work with the police station's video equipment). *In model talk...*



See Young enjoyed building Monogram's classic 1:32 Wirbelwind self-propelled flak gun, and added that after you build this kit you can actually play with it!





Cliff Kranz used a trailer from his box of random parts and combined it with an extra tractor he had in a Round 2 mixer kit that was missing some parts (Round 2 provided Cliff with an entire second kit when Cliff asked them!).



He built two Autocar trucks with midwestern features – one truck with an IMC tank for delivering home heating oil, brush-painted gloss black, and a dump truck featuring a heated bed to help things move out of the bed in cold weather.











Cliff also built the P-38J "YIPPEE," starting with the Hasegawa 1:48 kit; he hit a snag and used an Academy kit to finish up, stealing detail parts from Hasegawa to help out.



Ron Wergin used the old Airfix kit to build a Commonwealth Aircraft Boomerang; he likes the Airfix kit better than the more recent Special Hobby kit because Airfix depicts the rear cockpit more accurately. Ron added landing lights to the wings of his model.

Frank Babbitt is working on a 1:48 conversion of Eduard's Fw 190, aiming to build an Fw 190A-7.





Mark Schynert combined an old Aviation Usk Typhoon and a resin fuselage from Kora to create a 1:72 Hawker Tornado, which he fitted with a modified propeller taken from an Airfix Firefly Mk. V kit.







Mark also had an MPM XP-47H on the table, repaired with a replacement tail wheel from a scrapped Tamiya P-47D, and a Ki-61 from Tamiya in 1:72 that's about ready for painting.

Gabriel Lee's Puerto Rico Air National Guard F-16A ADF was in the home stretch when his wash had a weird interaction with the clear coat and caused some blistering. It may go to the shelf of doom, he warns



(don't do it, Gabriel!).







Kent McClure's projects this month included a Pioneer Yak-15 which has a couch for the pilot but is

otherwise accurate, and a Pioneer 1:72 Lippisch P.13 which he outfitted with an ejection seat from an He 162.

Mike Meek is eschewing his usual air racers in favor of a wartime P-47D Thunderbolt in 1:48, using the Tamiya kit as the basis for his build.







Ben Pada calls the decal sheets from the 1998 Nationals "the best Nationals sheets ever," and he's using one of them on an Eduard 1:48 P-51D to build Pierce McKennon's "Ridge Runner." He used a resin interior to improve the Mustang.

Ben also has a Hasegawa P-40E Warhawk under way; he says it's a great kit except for the fit of the glass behind the cockpit.

He's painted his P-40E with Gunze paints.







Landon Carr was excited to show off the snap-together motorized M1A1 Abrams he got while on vacation in Hawaii.

Dad **John Carr** helped get a few stubborn things to fit on the model.

John is working on a pair of Space Battleships: Yamato, one being built "stock" and a second one boasting many modifications from John's imagination to make it a more fearsome battleship.







He's also working on a rough kit of the FT-17 tank; he says nothing fits and the tracks have 40 pieces per side. He replaces the springs in the suspension with springs taken from ballpoint pens.



Karsten Krueger built his own motorized vehicle, a 1:10 Traxis Bandit capable of 70mph (scale speed, one hopes).

He also had a 1:16 car, which he said was even more fun to drive.





Geoff Krueger finished work on a 1:48 A-7E Corsair II which depicts the last cruise of VA-172 with the SLUF. He used a WolfPack cockpit and seat to dress up the Hasegawa kit, and weathered it heavily after applying decals from AirDoc.



The Hasegawa A-7 is an older kit, but the Kittyhawk UH-1Y Venom is a new one – Geoff tackled that one, too, using Quinta Studios 3D decals to dress up the cockpit.



Geoff says the kit is overengineered but comes out well.







Pat Nichols used the Barracuda Studios wicker chair to dress up Eduard's 1:48 Bristol Fighter,







Chris Bucholtz completed his Aoshima 1:72 N1K2-J Shiden Kai, giving it a worn, chipped finish using the salt masking method. He used paints that are all extinct – Testors Metallizers and Aeromaster IJN green


OKAY with that windy preamble and hallelujah we'll proceed to briefly cover how July 2022 went for us at the Santa Clara Game Kastle meet!
