I am in awe and humble thanks to Chris B. and his team who did so many Journal NATS issues, it's miraculous -mb



Editor Look: SVC #8 As A Manner of Analytics

In Fall 2022, after a very trying series of postponements, SVSM 1st VP/ Contest Director Mike Woolson delivered the 7th SV Classic at the Napredak Hall. Mike had been at the helm of every Classic since he began them after taking reins from Mick Burton who closed out the last Kickoff Classic in 2013 at the Santa Clara Convention Center. Mike had moved us back to Napredak

as a major cost saving measure. But after 9 years there hosting seven Classics and now Mike going on to other things, incoming E-Board found that Napredak now as expensive as the SCCC Hall. Without the benefit of 25k square feet for that kind of money. Re-tooling, restoring our exhausted monies while also trying to find someone who wanted to helm getting Classic back underway including finding new, affordable venue, saw us taking a 21 month layover. Happily, Chris Bucholtz found he wanted this project. More happily the Fremont Elks Lodge already having been proven out by similar use by Fremont Hornets, was found to be also available/affordable, and with great effort a mighty team forged a path to see us "Hit The Beach" with these results you now can peruse and consider here at your leisure:

STATS & SUCH FOR EIGHTH SILICON VALLEY CLASSIC 6/15/24

117 MODELERS ENTERED 429 Items (true total on table, as essentially no entry had additional items within "single entry item", such as can occur with collections entries for instance)

(55 more modelers 117 more model entries than last contest year, was done in 2022)

105 Senior, 3 Junior, 9 Youth (Subjunior) class contestants in division (49 more Senior, 2 more Junior, 4 more Youth)

*Breakdown: Of original 50 Senior categories, THREE had no entries, with FIVE split

Of original 5 Junior categories, TWO had NO entries with no splits required Of original 5 Youth categories, NONE had NO entries with no splits required

*Entries: 5 categories had NO entry, 3 Senior, 2 in Junior, 0 in Youth

2 categories had only ONE entry (2 in Senior ONLY)

6 categories had only TWO entries, 4 in Senior, 2 in Youth, 0 in Junior

With 4 split packages available atop the 50 categories ended up using FIVE (had added potential due 5 no entry cats)

There in fact were many, many success stories to report and analyze during, after the 8th SV Classic, however one of my favorites was that our efforts working with members of club who are also key players in other communities, again saw great entrant response in a newer set of categories. What you see below is an abundance of Gundam/Mecha, yes!

Note above of course, that the number indicates a winning modeler(s) from that place. Additionally, three cases saw two states besides CA taking home several wins, 2 in Nevada (Henderson-7, North Las Vegas-1) and 1 in Arizona (Scottsdale-2) In any case, North and South fairly abundantly again represented here having at least 1 win. I think it illustrates how competitive and also judiciously judged SV Classic manages to be. By the way, although not showing here as he didn't place, we also had an entrant from The United Kingdom in the competition this year, thank you Mr. Ian Hartup of Leeds, for your participation with a Mustang Funny Car in category S31 Auto Comp. Closed Wheel!

ABOUT THOSE AWARDS

Speaking of awards, indeed, they are for the most part usually the second highest single item expense for these kinds of show events. This again was no different for SVC 8, and again there was basically almost no monies after the securing of the new locale which of course needed a deposit and a 30 days out pay of final rental on hand in interim.

Discussions in past about trying out "challenge coin" style lead to a fruitful effort, result with the new team members on SVC 8, and on the left is Senior 1/2/3 place awards at the show

With that dealt with handily, there had to be a practical solution that didn't go into high dollar/time intensive places, for the important Special Awards sets.

Chris Bucholtz came up with means to that end with an elegant recycling concept. Basically giving up a goodly number of the clear acrylic sandwich blocks that had been awarded him over years, to re-use with a nice twist

Namely as "Postage Service", as all these new Specials for SV Classic 8 came as themed US Postage Stamps,

along with a new award badging adhered to each that identified award, added class to the "brick", nice & affordable



2024 is the 60th anniversary of the Ford version, and it's always a popular subject in model terms, excellent pairing

The George Lee Family Award is in honor of a legend in SF Bay Area modelling as well a name known around the Modelling World globe, dear Mr George Lee. The IPMS USA gives the Judges Grand Award (Senior Best of Show) nowadays as: The George Lee Grand Award, and this is who they are referencing. George was a superb gentleman and a master scratchbuild modeler, IPMS USA member and long time member of the legendary Golden Gate Chapter which was formally known as IPMS-San Francisco. Several of us were fortunate to have had time with George and known a goodly number whose lives he touched like ours. Chris has stayed in touch with the family over the years and it's great we could do a little something to honor him again in his own part of the world.

Another who left us far too soon and was another gentleman of stout heart, fierce honor, passionate about his modelling

(as well as team tennis, college football & Ayrton Senna) was dear Angelo Deogracias, better known to me as SPAD. He sponsored this Best Competition Car Award in honor of Ayrton Senna after his untimely death in 1994 for us until his own untimely passing in 2012. 3 of us continued award in Angelo's memory all the way through SV Classic # 6.





One more Special here, SA6 The Best Lockheed Subject award, which was the Bob Diehl Memorial. Chris knew Bob. Bob was a silent but might contributor to the SVSM over the years, and Chris saw to it we honored him in classy style. The picture above shows Bob's daughter giving the award to the winner (who hailed from Santa Barbara and won with his great 1/48th P-38) whilst Chris and all look on. Very nice work, Mr Contest Director.
